FROM KEVIN BRANEY, PRINCIPAL

Dear Students, Parents, and Friends of Boulder High School:

As we approach the end of the first semester of the 2010–2011 school year, I reflect on our accomplishments thus far—**our outstanding students:** 11 National Merit Semi-finalists, 18 National Merit Commended students, 98 AP Scholars, 47 AP Scholars with HonoSrs, 96 AP Scholars with Distinction, 23 National AP Scholars, two students earning a perfect score of 36 on the ACT exam; our outstanding, trophy-earning student athletes and teams: Boy's Soccer, Tennis, Cross Country, and the all-out effort of our Panther football team; Boulder High being named the 2010 Best Public High School by the Daily Camera's Best of Boulder; and not least, the unity, devotion, and pride demonstrated by our students when faced with adverse circumstances. I am very proud of our students, our staff, and the parents who support us all. This "team" is what makes Boulder High uniquely Boulder High.

Recently, individualized CSAP results were made available through the registrar's office. If you are interested in seeing the individualized scores for your Boulder High student, please feel free to see the registrar when you have an opportunity. On the whole, Boulder High School demonstrated improvement in all areas: math, reading, and writing. Furthermore, **Boulder High School's growth rate is exceeding the district average in all areas.** I am proud of our faculty's efforts to utilize CSAP and determine opportunities to enhance individual learning for our students. One area for continued focus during the 2010–2011 school year by our faculty will be student performance in the reading CSAP assessment. Upon further scrutiny by our school accountability committee (SAC), a group made up of administrators and teachers who write our yearly school improvement plan, our growth in reading as a whole needs to be

accelerated. There is a collective effort across all departments this year SAto enhance our efforts to teach reading strategies in all departments. I look forward to continuing this conversation with staff over the course of the year and engaging our PAC as well in this topic.

In the spring all juniors take the state-sponsored ACT college entrance exam at Boulder High. I am pleased to report that last spring **our juniors (now seniors) not only surpassed both the state and district scores in every category, but improved on our prior year's scores in every category.** Our scores (out of a perfect 36) were the following: English 23.1, Math 24.0, Reading 24.6, Science 23.4, and the Composite 23.9. To me, these results demonstrate that we are on the right path and are continuing to build upon an excellent academic learning program. Student learning goals, expectations, teaching methods, and implementation plans are outlined in more detail in our recently-completed School Improvement Plan. This plan provides the strategies and focus for maximizing the student learning experience at Boulder High.

For those of you considering Boulder High for your student for the 2011–2012 school year, I invite you to our **Showcase Evening**, Monday, November 29, at 6:00 pm. I realize this is a busy time and the day we return from the Thanksgiving break, so I encourage you to mark your calendars now. We will also be offering **school tours** on Fridays, starting December 3, and **shadowing** during the week of January 10. Additionally, I will be hosting **Coffee with the Principal** on December 8 and January 7. Please see our website for registration and detailed information.

Underclassmen will find support for finals preparation with **Cramfest**, offered by our Panther Pride members on December 9 from 3:00–6:00 pm. This is a great opportunity to get questions answered and concepts clarified. I encourage all students to stay focused during this busy holiday season; you’re almost done with the first semester!

Congrats to all of our fall sports for a very successful season. It was a real treat to watch our student-athletes compete at such a high level and progress as far as they did into the playoffs. Thank you to the coaches, parents, and supporters of our athletic programs. We couldn't do it without you!

To our seniors and senior parents—believe it or not January brings the beginning of **graduation planning**. Jostens will be at Boulder High on January 24 to meet with our seniors and distribute cap and gown ordering information (orders are to be turned in January 27–28).

I look forward to seeing many of you at our second semester activities. Please keep in touch! Happy holidays to you all, and I hope you have an enjoyable and restful winter break.

COUNSELORS' CORNER

College Applications — Finishing the Application Process

Once you have submitted your college applications, either by mail or online, don't forget to have your transcripts and test scores sent! Your counselor will need the following:

- A stamped, addressed envelope for each school to which you are applying that is neither Common Application (blue computer screen with red CA in the middle) nor electronic eligible (open blue computer screen)
- Any forms your schools require to be filled out by a counselor (Counselor Report Form/Secondary School Report)
- \$2.00 for each official transcript

If you need a letter of recommendation from your counselor, don't forget that we need to know three to four weeks before the due date so we have time to write it!

Also, be sure to have your test scores sent to your colleges. Many colleges require that you have your scores sent directly from College Board and/or ACT. Log on to www.actstudent.org or www.collegeboard.com for instructions on how to send your scores.

Requesting Midyear Grade Reports

Request midyear grade reports in January in the Counseling Office. Complete a request form and attach \$2.00 for each request. Please provide a stamped, addressed envelope for each school that is neither Common Application nor electronic eligible.

Obtaining Transcripts

To be considered official, a transcript must be mailed by a BHS counselor or the registrar. A transcript that is delivered by a student is considered to be unofficial.

Senior Diploma Application and Graduation Credit Check

Parents: Your senior should have completed a senior graduation credit check by now. If the credit check is not yet complete, have your senior sign up NOW to meet with his/her counselor before Winter Break.

Seniors: Remember to bring your completed Application for Diploma and your Release of Records form to your appointment.

Scholarship Information

Scholarship information may be accessed through the Naviance computer website. You can use your own password or sign in as a guest with the password "**panthers.**" On the left margin of Naviance, select "**Scholarship List.**" Don't forget to check this website frequently as new scholarships are added all the time. Another comprehensive list is located on the Boulder High School website under "**Counseling.**"

Attention: Juniors, Sophomores, and Freshmen!!

Course selection for next year is coming up in February. To enter your selections you must have an active Infinite Campus password. See Mrs. Roy in the Counseling Office if you need a password or assistance with your account.

COUNSELORS' CORNER

A Grade-level Guide to Naviance

9th Grade	Counselors are meeting with students during Freshmen Seminar classes throughout the year to work on the Career Interest Inventory and make a Game Plan. Students will select some careers and set some goals for their high school education in their Naviance accounts.
10th Grade	Students take a personality test (based on Myers-Briggs) which will provide feedback concerning their most likely career paths, college majors, and the colleges which offer these majors.
11th Grade	Counselors work with students to continue to develop college choices based on career paths/personality tests. In order to explore postsecondary options, students will examine Naviance functions such as "College Search," "Scholarships," and "Scattergrams" (GPA's and test scores plotted on a graph for every college to which Boulder High students have applied in the past three years).
12th Grade	Students utilize Naviance to finalize their list of colleges to which they will apply. As well, there will be several mandatory surveys for seniors to take during the spring semester.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS

A Slice of Life at the National High School Model United Nations

Exhaustion. Picture a room with 30 aspiring diplomats duking it out over solutions to the 1969 Southern Rhodesian apartheid crisis. Franco's Spain pushes a thinly disguised fascist agenda, while Zambia boasts improvements after shaking off its own minority-rule government.

It's March, and these students have spent the past three months painstakingly preparing their position statements. They must inhabit the thoughts of their countries even more convincingly and thoroughly than in any other regional conference.

Now it's the big leagues. Students convene in New York City for a grueling three-day conference where they debate anything from the 1969 Situation in South Rhodesia to the current humanitarian crisis in Darfur, Sudan. Delegates in the advanced Security Council face a special challenge.

At one o'clock in the morning on the second day of NHSMUN, coordinators pound on their hotel room doors waking the delegates from cherished rest. Forced from their pajamas back into formal western attire, they file down to the conference rooms to debate unexpected crises. Their only consolation prize for the early rise—a piece of greasy pizza.

Focusing on the 1969 Historic Security Council, Franco's Spain fights a losing battle for continued white minority rule against the entire council, while other delegates debate the controversial minutia of the resolutions.

How exactly would voting rights be settled? How should Southern Rhodesia be treated by the United Nations? Just one word can alter an entire resolution. These proposed solutions circle the room as amendments quickly follow in their paths. Everyone has something to add, change, or delete.

Tensions run high and stress overcomes those who aren't well prepared. However, the vast majority of students leave with a heightened sense of self-worth and empowerment, having spent three days solving the world's problems.

At last year's NHSMUN *Rosa Baum* (12) represented Zambia with *Aidan Milliff* (12), and *Peter Repucci* (12) represented Spain with grad *Emily Thompson* (DU). These students were four of eleven National H.S. Model United Nations award winners in the last three years from Boulder High School.

This year's BHS MUN team will participate in the Cornell University Model United Nations, March 10–14. Before attending, they will have been student-delegates at MUN conferences at Boulder High School, Regis Jesuit High School, the Denver Center for International Studies, and the University of Colorado.
