FROM KEVIN BRANEY, PRINCIPAL

Dear Students, Parents, and Friends of Boulder High School:

Second semester is in full swing. Our students seem motivated and engaged, and the programs we began last semester continue to grow and have a positive impact on our learning environment.

I want to thank some very special Boulder High parents for their dedicated support of our open enrollment activities, specifically: *Birgit Schanz* and *Mary Jean O'Hair* and their crack team of volunteers for organizing and facilitating our two weeks of shadowing — a massive matching, phone-calling, computer-logging enterprise that made Boulder High shine for prospective students. And for Showcase, *Leah Kahn* and *Jody McCarthy*, and their volunteers whose efforts and dedication made our Showcase evenings the perfect means to share with our community what Boulder High is all about. I thank Birgit, MJ, Leah, and Jody for their passion and commitment to Boulder High.

Our counselors have done an outstanding job processing over 1,600 college applications. For our counselors this represents the culmination of four years of successfully guiding students — from goals development, to achievement planning, and solid college choices. Congratulations to our counselors and our remarkable senior class.

Speaking of seniors — your time is coming! Caps and gowns have been ordered, and perhaps party planning is underway. Senior parents will soon be receiving the first of two letters regarding graduation. Graduation will be Saturday, May 21, at 9 am, at our own Recht Field. No tickets are necessary and all are welcome.

For our freshmen and sophomores, CSAP is on the horizon. CSAP testing will be conducted the mornings of March 1, 2, 8, and 9. Juniors and seniors will have classes only in the afternoon (a special class schedule for those days will be posted soon on our website). As you may already know, CSAP results are one factor in our per-student state funding

as well as determining our school “rating,” an important factor for many when considering Boulder High for their students. I encourage all students to attend and be conscientious during testing days, and for parents to make any necessary doctor, dentist, or other appointments during non-school hours on those days. I thank you in advance for your support.

Our teachers now have available to them a “missing homework” function through Infinite Campus. If a teacher chooses to use this feature, parents will receive an email when a student has an assignment in the class that is marked as an “M” (missing). The emails will be sent to those addresses listed in Infinite Campus.

The programs I referred to above are our work on equity and parent engagement. We have made significant strides towards our goal of truly making Boulder High “A Place for Everyone” with our student unity council and through our equity and parent engagement meetings. We are carefully considering and rethinking our traditional approaches to different things and the way we plan for the future. I am inspired and challenged by our efforts. All are welcome to join us.

Lastly, I want to thank our community for supporting education through the passing of the BVSD Ballot Measure 3A. One of the most important outcomes of this is the ability to reduce class size, originally increased due to funding cuts for the 2010–2011 school year. I will keep you posted through our website of additional changes we will be able to make as a result of Ballot Measure 3A. These positive changes that directly impact student learning would not have been possible without your support of and belief in our public schools.

Course Selection for Current 9th, 10th, and 11th Graders

2011–2012 course selection for current 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students starts on February 1 with a presentation in the auditorium. Students will receive important information and course selection materials.

Students should do the following:

- Talk with their teachers about appropriate levels of courses and other courses offered in their departments. Advising will take place in classrooms from February 2–11.
- Complete any necessary applications (available from teachers).
- Obtain teacher signatures on course request forms.
- Have parent/guardian sign course request form.

Students will enter course requests at a pre-determined time with the counselors in a Boulder High computer lab.

Incoming 9th grade students and parents should definitely plan to attend this important evening event. Counselors and teachers will give a general presentation after which teachers from each discipline will be available to advise and answer questions.

Junior Planning

Counselors will be meeting with all juniors in March to help students reach their post-secondary goals. This is an important step in the college selection and application process.

Juniors should pay close attention to announcements on Panther TV and make an appointment in a timely manner.

Selective Service for Senior Men

Did you know that registration with the Selective Service is a requirement for enrollment in state-supported colleges and universities? All men turning 18 are required to register with the Selective Service. Make sure that this is on your son's graduation checklist. Forms are available at a post office or at www.sss.gov.service.

College Applications & Mid-Year Reports

Congratulations to those seniors who have already turned in their college applications! As of January 15, we have processed close to 1,600 applications.

Parents: Ensure that your senior keeps track of college deadlines. Mid-year reports were sent to colleges by the end of January. If your student needs a mid-year report, he or she should come to the counseling office to complete the mid-year request form.

Scholarship Information

The process of applying for scholarships and/or financial aid can be overwhelming for students. Parental involvement is essential. A list of scholarships is available on Naviance. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and CSS Profile forms are available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

COLLEGE BOARD TEST INFORMATION

SAT/ACT/PSAT Tests

Students who are considering applying to colleges or universities that require the SAT I or ACT tests for admission consideration should plan to take such tests in the spring of their junior year. Students who plan to file early-decision applications should check with their counselors and the colleges for specific requirements.

The PSAT is a test that students may take to practice for the SAT. It is offered once a year in October. Juniors and sophomores are encouraged to take advantage of this practice opportunity. PSAT scores from junior year tests determine National Merit Scholarship awards.

SAT II Subject Tests

Students who are considering applying to colleges or universities that require SAT II tests should take the tests when the material is fresh in their minds. For example:

- History and Science — Take the test in spring of the year the course is completed.
- Foreign Language — Take the test in spring of the last year in which the language is taken or, if continued, in spring of the junior year or fall of the senior year.
- Math and English — Take the test in the spring of the junior year or fall of the senior year to satisfy specific admissions requirements.

Colorado ACT Test

All Colorado juniors are required to take the ACT test, at no charge to the student. The writing portion of the ACT is NOT included. This year BHS will administer the test on Wednesday, April 27. Students who are not satisfied with their score from that test date can pay to retake the test either in June of this year or in the fall of their senior year.

Registering for the ACT and SAT Tests

Students may register by mail or online. Advance registration is required and we advise students to register early to get their first choice test location and avoid late registration fees. Mail-in registration booklets are available in the counseling office.

Are You Ready To Take The SAT/ACT?

Have you studied? Want to know what you will score before you take the actual test?

Boulder Public Library's Learn-a-Test database allows you to take the SAT, SAT II writing, ACT, ASVAB, and many more standardized tests. You can time your practice test and receive immediate scoring – so you know exactly where to focus your studies before you take the real test.

You can access the database from the library or with a valid Boulder Public Library card from home. Go to Boulder Public Library's website, www.boulder.lib.co.us, and under **Databases & Reference Links**, click **education > learning express > college entrance exams**. AP Exams – May 2-13

The AP exam provides a means by which secondary school students enrolled in AP courses may demonstrate their readiness to take advanced courses as college freshmen. If their college or university grants advanced placement, a student has more freedom in course selection because certain courses may be skipped. The college or university may also grant college credit based on the score earned on the AP exam.

Students should consult their AP teachers. Registration information will be available on the Boulder High website.

Introduction to the Student Aid Report (SAR)

The Student Aid Report (SAR) is a summary of the information you entered on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Why is the SAR important?

Your SAR is the form that tells you how much student aid you are eligible to receive from the federal government and how much the government expects your family to pay (EFC or Expected Family Contribution).

What happens after I receive my SAR?

Immediately check your EFC (on upper right of page 1), and check for any mistakes or errors (pages 5–8). Any colleges

you listed on your FAFSA will also receive a copy of your SAR. Notify your prospective schools' aid offices immediately to make corrections. A delay could mean less aid.

What if I don't receive my SAR?

Call 1.800.433.3243 if you do not receive your SAR in 3–4 weeks.

When do I receive my aid?

Once your prospective colleges review your SAR and verify your eligibility, they will each construct an aid package and send an award letter. You do not need to accept all of the aid that's offered to you; accept only the aid you want.

ICAPs at Boulder High School: How Parents Can Help

The Counseling Department is busy implementing a process to ensure that all students have Individual Career and Academic Plans in progress by September of 2011. Some of the components of the ICAP are:

- Interest /temperament inventories, which lead to
- Postsecondary and workforce goals, which influence
- Anticipated secondary studies leading to these goals.

Each student will also have an online account to house these inventories, goals, and four-year high school plan as well as resumes and "brag sheets" to be used in the college application process. Students may also store goals for contextual and service learning, college searches, and scholarship searches for easy access and organization.

At Boulder High, the ICAPS will largely be completed and accessed through the Naviance program. Most of our students currently have accounts. Parents are also encouraged to have Naviance accounts and may activate one by contacting the student's academic counselor. Through your parent account, you will be able to view your child's portfolio, as well as access all search possibilities for careers, college majors, colleges, and scholarships. It is the tool your students will use as seniors to manage their college applications, so early familiarity will help with everyone's anxiety level!

We are excited to bring ICAPS to everyone at Boulder High. We believe that these structured, goal-setting activities can open doors to a bright future.
